But is that ALL I must do? Lent is a 40-day period of prayer, fasting and almsgiving that starts on Ash Wednesday and ends at folly Thursday. How about going beyond the usual practice of "giving up" something and try doing a

Here are some ideas for consideration:

Write letters and cards to family and friends.

Perform an act of kindness to a stranger.

Make phone calls to touch base with family, friends or shut ins.

Spend an evening or a weekend as a volunteer helping at a charity facility/shelter.

Make it a practice to fast from insensitive, cruel comments or gossiping about others.

Take an hour of social media time to reflect quietly on your day's accomplishments.

Reconcile with a family member or friend.

Pray especially for people you don't like or for those who don't like you.

Reach out to the spouse of a recently departed Brother.

Turn off the TV/computer and spend quality time with family or someone in need.

Clean out a closet, pantry or cabinets and donate gently used items to a shelter.

Think before you speak: Would Jesus say that?



Chaplain's Message

Dear Brothers. Lady Knights, and friends of the Knights,

What is Lent? "Lent is a 40 day season of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving that begins on Ash Wednesday and ends at sundown on Holy Thursday. It's a period of preparation to celebrate the Lord's Resurrection at Easter. During Lent, we seek the Lord in prayer by reading Sacred Scripture; we serve by giving alms; and we practice self-control through fasting. We are called not only to abstain from luxuries during Lent, but to a true inner conversion of heart as we seek to follow Christ's will more faithfully. We recall the waters of baptism in which we were also baptized into Christ's death, died to sin and evil, and began new life in Christ.



Many know of the tradition of abstaining from meat on Fridays during Lent, but we are also called to practice self-discipline and fast in other ways throughout the season. Contemplate the meaning and origins of the Lenten fasting tradition in this reflection. In addition, the giving of alms is one way to share God's gifts—not only through the distribution of money, but through the sharing of our time and talents. As St. John Chrysostom reminds us: "Not to enable the poor to share in our goods is to steal from them and deprive them of life. The goods we possess are not ours, but theirs." (Catechism of the Catholic Church, no. 2446).

In Lent, the baptized are called to renew their baptismal commitment as others prepare to be baptized through the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, a period of learning and discernment for individuals who have declared their desire to become Catholics." USCCB (United States Conference of Catholic Bishops)

Depriving ourselves or "giving up" something for Lent, is meant to make us more open to what God is calling us to be. Depriving ourselves or "Giving up" is actually allowing God Himself to fill that fasting void. This Lent, let us empty ourself - so that the Lord may fill us with His grace and presence.
