We Miss You! We keep inviting you. We make a good breakfast, but no one comes! We have a super community supper, but we only had 48 guests last Wednesday and that included all the volunteers who paid for their dinner.

Is it the menu? Is it the price? Or is this just not something you want to support for your Council? Needless to say, frustration is running way ahead of our understanding of why so few of our Knights & Ladies & friends forget about us.

Maybe you could give up one Sunday morning to have breakfast at Columbus Hall. Richard Thomas and his cooking team prepare an enticing menu of two kinds of eggs, sausage, bacon, pancakes, cream chipped beef, and biscuits and toast. Of course, coffee and refills, milk and orange juice are always available as well.

And how about our off-season Wednesday night community suppers? They usually run from September to May. Kevin Hughes with brother John Hughes and Chuck McCready (and sometimes Kellen, Kevin's grandson, is on hand to help) spend lots of hours planning, shopping, and preparing, most of the time, 3-course excellent meals. Kevin always makes sure there is a choice if you do not care for the main course or if it is something you cannot eat.

In the past we prepared for 100 plus guests, but the last two events produced only 46 folks for breakfast and 48 for Community Supper.

In addition to the cooks, we have dedicated volunteers who show up to serve, cashier, pour coffee and clean up afterwards. Many times our volunteers just shake their heads and wonder where is everyone? Morale is low and sometimes food is wasted. We CAN do better! Or the alternative is eliminating breakfast and/or community supper. Generating enough sales to produce a profit in which the Council is funded and extra proceeds can be given to our charities is becoming a difficult task!

So with the breakfast & community supper team volunteers still willing to prep some great meals for you, are you willing to make a commitment and attend these Council functions?

With this said, How about Seafood Nights? Starting in July we will once again be hosting Tuesday Seafood Nights. For nine

Tuesdays this summer, you are invited to feast on Kevin Hughes & Co. seafood delights & of course, hard shell crabs. (Last I heard we


were going to look into soft-shell crabs as well.)




