

During the winter months, one of our successful events has been our Simple Suppers. For a nominal fee, each person partakes in a very simple home-cooked meal. We open up the bar at 4:00 p.m. for anyone who arrives early, and we encourage all to stay late and bring a game or play the slot machines.

HIGHLIGHTS

The highlight of each Simple Supper is the food. Different couples take a turn each month and plan their own specialties. This month our Past Grand Knight and Past District Deputy, Mike Carozza, and his wife, Mary Lou, provided us with two different homemade soups, turkey or ham sandwiches, salad and dessert for \$7.00. It was fantastic!

PURPOSE OF THE EVENT

The purpose of the event is to bring families together to share a meal and to enjoy some great conversation. We make very little money, and we discourage talking business for one night.

PLANNING

Early in the fall, the council compiles a list of volunteer chefs and possible menus. Each couple is responsible for their own planning, including additional people to serve and clean up afterwards, but, if needed, the Columbus Hall volunteer kitchen staff is always there to lend a hand.

PROMOTION

Announcements are made at Council meetings and reminders are sent out in our weekly email updates. Several signs are located in front of the Columbus Hall on Coastal Highway. Announcements are made in the Church bulletin, and a pulpit announcement is made at all the Masses just prior to the event. A local newspaper also advertises our suppers in their local events column.



EVENT SUMMARY

This year, thanks to no snow our Knights were able to plan for and attend both events.

HIGHLIGHTS

The highlight this year was to finally participate in the march in Washington, D.C. Because of snow, our Council had to cancel our last two trips. What a thrill it was to hear Vice-President Pence speak to us all. His support is vital in overturning Roe vs. Wade someday. Coming from a Council with so many older gentlemen, it was great to see so many young people participating from all around the country. There were so many seminarians and priests there with baby faces. We all enjoyed speaking with Brother Knights from other states.

PURPOSE OF THE EVENT

The purpose of the event was to raise awareness about the murder of our unborn children and to let the powers-to-be know that there are so many of us and that we are not going away anytime soon.

PLANNING

Our planning started early in the fall. Brothers Tom Anderson and Bill McGarrity were determined to sign up youngsters from our local Catholic elementary school and CCD programs. Brothers Tom and Bill contacted Most Blessed Sacrament principle, Mark Record, and the Directors of Religious Education from the surrounding parishes. Our Council made a deposit of \$100 with the bus company for a reservation. The two Brothers contacted another nearby parish to inquire about available seats on their bus in the event that we could not get enough participants to travel to Washington, D.C., in our bus.



EVENT SUMMARY

For the past two years, Ocean City's Grand Knight, Wayne Straight, has used the second meeting of the month to present different topics that pertain to our local community. This month's speaker was a task force officer (name omitted for obvious reasons) with the FBI's Joint Terrorism Task Force (JTTF). In addition to his work with JTTF, this officer is also the head of Ocean City, Maryland, Department of Intelligence. His presentation began by soliciting the audience for a definition of terrorism. After getting a few definitions, he continued his PowerPoint presentation which defined terrorism and the reasons why a person becomes a terrorist. The officer explained that while Ocean City is not a high profile target, during the summer months Ocean City population-wise becomes the second largest city in Maryland. He explained to everyone how to report suspicious behavior and how to protect oneself in the event that there is an actual attack. He concluded his presentation by answering from the audience.

HIGHLIGHTS

The highlight of the officer's presentation was the feeling that everyone received knowing that procedures are in place to protect everyone in Ocean City. The speaker reassured us that the department does not take any situation lightly, and therefore, we should not feel alone. He stated that the police force here in Ocean City has many resources in the surrounding areas that are available to it. In summary, he said that taking preparatory action can assure everyone that we can exert a measure of control even in the face of a terrorist attack.

PURPOSE OF THE EVENT

The purpose of the event was to inform our community about the procedures involved if we were to experience a terrorist attack.

PLANNING

After determining a special topic, we try to look within our own Council for a possible speaker. Brother Brandon Reim, one of our younger members who works directly under this task force officer at the Ocean City Police Department (OCPD),

contacted his supervisor and arranged for him to speak to us. Brandon also provided a projector for the presentation. The Ladies Auxiliary helped by bringing desserts which everyone shared after the presentation/meeting.

EVENT SUMMARY

As Christmas draws near each December, Christmas becomes more and more commercialized. To help 'keep Christ in Christmas', Ocean City Council #9035 runs its annual Christmas Poster Contest.

HIGHLIGHTS

The Knights of Columbus Council #9053 sponsored the Keep Christ in Christmas Poster contest in 2016. Three local parishes, St. Luke, St. John Neumann and Holy Savior/St. Mary's Star of the Sea, and Most Blessed Sacrament Catholic School (MBS) participated. PURPOSE OF THE EVENT

The contest provides the children from the local parishes and MBS the opportunity to reflect on and develop their response to the theme 'Keep Christ in Christmas'. The process brings together clergy, directors of religious education (DRE's), teachers, students, families and Knights in a celebration of their Catholic Faith.

PLANNING

Early in the fall of 2016, Brother Knight Tom Herwig, ordered the program kit (#CPC-Kit). Council #9053's Church Activities Director, Brother Steve Mastbrook, in consultation with the Grand Knight, Wayne Straight, selected a team to administer the contest. The team organized the poster contest around the St. Luke's and MBS's calendars to provide ample time to notify DRE's and teachers of the rules


