Worthy Brothers, Ladies and Friends,

I hope each of you had a wonderful and relaxing Christmas with friends and family. It is a special time to spend some quite time and reflect on why we have Christmas. The gift God gave us, his Son, is difficult for me to comprehend. I am a sinner, and yet he shows his love for me and his forgiveness through his Sacred Heart of Mercy. That thought alone gives me hope and courage to walk in faith toward Him to become a part of the Mystical Body of Christ.

New Year 2025, so many thoughts and things to say. We all dread the new years resolution "game", and we all know the outcome year after year. I plan on taking some quite time over a few days to reflect on where I am as an individual, where I am in my Faith journey, and my relationships with family and friends. Joe Gangi's finial life lesson to me, remember you never know the day or the hour when I will be called to face God. There is always a segment of my prayer life of asking Jesus what I can do to be a better Catholic. I also ask each of you, myself included, to reflect on and take stock of your life as a Knight of Columbus. Our Council has a great heritage of Charity work within the Ocean City community. We are driven because it is one of the pivotal aspects of our mission: Knights are called to serve others. Our first principle is Charity – at home with our families and in our communities. When Knights of Columbus members come together, they accomplish great things. Spend some time and reflect, where do I fit in with this first principle of Charity. Our charity work dovetails nicely with the Beatitudes. Maybe make some resolutions this year to attend more meetings, help in a charity activity, join in fellowship with Brother Knights at meals, help where you can. If you are a 4th degree Knight, reflect how you can actively participate in the Veterans Memorial Mass and ceremony, Wreaths Across America, Veterans breakfast, and other activities. 

A highlight of the Eulogy presented by Joe's son was the reading of Chapter 13 of 1st Corinthians. It was a poignant moment and I thought it worthy of our tribute.

1 Corinthians, Chapter 13: Love

- 1: If I speak in the tongues of men and of angels, but have not love, I am only a ringing gong or a clanging cymbal. 2-If I have the gift of prophecy and can fathom all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have absolute faith so as to move mountains, but have not love, I am nothing. 3-If I give all I possess to the poor and exult in the surrender of my body, but have not love, I gain nothing.
- 4: Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. 5-It is not rude, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no account of wrongs. 6-Love takes no pleasure in evil, but rejoices in the truth. 7-It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things.
- 8: Love never fails. But where there are prophecies, they will cease; where there are tongues, they will be restrained; where there is knowledge, it will be dismissed. 9-For we know in part and we prophesy in part, 10-but when the perfect comes, the partial passes away.
- 11: When I was a child, I talked like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child. When I became a man, I set aside childish ways. 12-Now we see but a dim reflection as in a mirror; then we shall see face to face. Now I know in part; then I shall know fully, even as I am fully known.
- 13: And now these three remain: faith, hope, and love; but the greatest of these is love.

Faith In Action

From our Chaplain, Father Lance Martin... Catholic New Year Resolutions...

Read the Bible: Put the Bible somewhere convenient and open it up once a day.

Pray more: Pray for others throughout the day. You can also visit Jesus in the tabernacle

weekly.

Be kind: Look for ways to do good without being noticed.

Renew your devotion: Although New Year's is a secular holiday, it can be a good time to renew your devotion to God.

Choose a saintly intercessor: Make a point to pray for a particular saint's intercession throughout the year. Learn more about them by reading about their life.

Keep a gratitude journal: Write down things you are grateful for.

Abstain from meat every Friday: Abstaining from meat is only required on Fridays during Lent, but it is encouraged throughout the year. Observing meatless Fridays is a great way to increase in spiritual discipline and frequently recall Jesus' Passion.

Do an Examination of Conscience before you go to sleep: This is often done before Confession, but it's a good practice to get into at the end of your day. Not only do we recall the sins we may have committed, we also recall how God was with us throughout the day and we ask for His grace to be better the next day.

Seek spiritual guidance: Consider finding an accountability partner.

Bless your house: Ask a priest to perform a blessing on your house and then, make a habit of sprinkling your home with Holy Water daily.



Insurance Report, January 2025

Happy New Year! I hope all of you had a joyous and merry Christmas. All of us start the new year afresh. We make resolutions. Let's plan now to look back at the end of 2024 and be able to say, "I kept those resolutions to improve myself, to improve my relationship with my family and friends, and my relationship with God!" An improved prayer life is the goal of many. I know I've made that resolution almost every year. Some years I do better than others. But here are few things I've found about making resolutions that helped me. First, I don't want to make a resolution that is not possible to keep. I have1 to be realistic. I can't go to an extreme. For example, to improve my prayer life, I can't go from praying for 15 minutes in the morning to reading a chapter of the Bible, attending daily Mass, reciting the rosary, and saying the Liturgy of the Hours each day. For me, that's too much of a jump. I'm going to follow that for a day or two and then something will get me off track. Myself, I need to take baby steps. Maybe start with saying the rosary each day. I've got to make my resolution achievable. The same is true of all those other resolutions we make. I can't go from being a couch potato to running six miles a day...but I could start by walking a mile each day as an achievable step in that direction. I can't starve myself trying to lose weight...but I could cut out snacks between meals as a start. Again, an achievable step. I might want to read more, so I can start by reading a chapter a day in a book. You get the idea. The resolution has to be reasonable, achievable, and specific.

Now here is one resolution that is reasonable, achievable, and specific: Resolve to meet with me to update the information on your family's financial needs analysis. (Or maybe you need to complete a financial needs analysis.) Let's see where you stand. Your financial health is critical to your family's future security. As your field agent I'm charged to meet with each of my members each year.

We can take a look at your goals and aspirations and make sure you're on track to keep your family appropriately protected. I'll contact you soon to see if an appointment should be our next step.
